PREARRANGED INTERVIEWS

If you have a prearranged interview, check the Job Center *Handout* (beginning on the next page) or the Electronic Search Committee Locator at the Information Booth for that institution's location. If your interview is in a room, go directly to the room close to your scheduled time. If your interview is at a table, go to the Candidate Check-In booth about 10 minutes before your scheduled interview. Water and seating space will be provided in a waiting area in the Marriott's Marriott Hall.

INTERVIEWS ARRANGED AT THE MEETING

If you seek to arrange interviews through the Job Center, read the *Handout* carefully. Institutions that are accepting c.v.'s have full position descriptions in the *Handout*. However, most institutions are conducting prearranged interviews only and are not collecting c.v.'s through the Job Center. Check the bulletin boards frequently for late-breaking announcements, additions, and cancellations. Please note that interviews are not guaranteed, unless they have been prearranged.

- ◆ Check the *Handout* for institutions that are accepting c.v.'s, and note the times that the institutions will be at their tables or in their interview rooms. Complete a message form (provided by the Job Center) for each position of interest to you. Staple the message form to a copy of your c.v. for each position to which you are applying. Proceed to the C.V. Collection Station in the Marriott Hall and give the Job Center staff your c.v.'s and message forms. The staff will file the form and c.v. in the respective institution's folder; institutions will collect the material from their folders periodically.
- ◆ Some positions on the bulletin boards are noninterviewing positions. Unless otherwise indicated, you should send the information requested in the position description directly to the institution.

RESPONSES TO INTERVIEW REQUESTS

The Job Center will use the Messaging System for applicants and interviewers to communicate about scheduling interviews. You can retrieve messages online through the Registration Resource Center at www.historians.org or in the Message Center in the Marriott Hall. When registering for the meeting, applicants will receive a registration number that will serve as the password into the system. Institutions wishing to set up interviews will contact applicants directly via the electronic messaging system or by telephone. Institutions wishing to decline interviews are asked to return their message forms to AHA staff, who will send a generic decline message via the messaging system. Applicants are recommended to frequently check the monitor listings to see if messages are waiting for them.

IMPORTANT NOTE: SOME INSTITUTIONS ARE INTERVIEWING IN HOTEL ROOMS OR SUITES RESERVED INDEPENDENTLY OF THE JOB CENTER. JOB CENTER STAFF *MAY* HAVE LOCATION INFORMATION, IF THE INSTITUTION HAS PROVIDED IT TO US. ASK AT THE INFORMATION BOOTH IN THE MARRIOTT'S MARRIOTT HALL.

DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA

Historians. The Office of the Historian, U.S. Department of State, Washington, D.C., in conjunction with a contracting agency, is seeking to identify individuals who are interested in working as contract historians on the department's official documentary series, Foreign Relations of the United States, and on policy-related historical studies and outreach programs. Requirements include knowledge of diplomatic history and U.S. foreign relations and a willingness to work on a variety of topics and geographic areas over time. Those fluent in the Russian, Spanish, Hebrew, or Arabic languages and specialists in modern Russian/Soviet history, modern Eurasian studies, U.S.-Latin American relations, Middle East history, and U.S. diplomatic history are especially encouraged to apply. The office anticipates a possible opening (or openings) for a contract position(s) during 2009. The anticipated opening(s) would be for a one-year contract position with the possibility of further extension(s). Professional historians with PhDs begin at approximately \$54,000, plus health benefits. All appointments must conform to the laws and regulations regarding service with the U.S. government. East Asia. The Underwood International College of Yonsei University in Seoul, South Korea, invites applications for a tenure-track assistant professorship in East Asian studies. Field is open, though enthusiastic attention will be given to applicants working in history and to those with interdisciplinary research interests who are able to teach a range of courses in the humanities.
